# Outcomes of breakout groups

- Breakouts 1 and 3: A need to deal with an agreement on three issues (**identification, authentication, authorisation**), a number of **open issues**, and some **elements that lack clarity**.
- Breakout 4: A need to **supplement** the eID Regulation in terms of eHealth e.g., **appropriate security** (rather than high); **organisational issues** (from on-the-spot to online consultation); understanding the **role** of healthcare professionals in order to build trust.

# Outcomes of breakout groups



- Breakout 2: Needs a **clear map** on how countries intend to use eID, and what level of **quality assurance** is needed; assess **relevance of the proposed Data Protection Regulation**.
