Top 5 issues identified

| # | Issue |
|---|-----------------------------------------------------------------------------------------|
| 1 | Is Identification alone sufficient? |
| 2 | What shall be in scope of the Regulation? |
| 3 | Difference between the identification of citizens as a patient and health professionals |
| 4 | Agreement: Every MS has its own system to identify citizens/patients |
| 5 | Clarify on EU level: Do we need a circle of trust? |

Conclusion

- Time for a profound discussion was too short!
- Agreement on 3 processes:
 - Identificaton
 - Authentication
 - Authorization
 - Not clear which processes can be used to achieve cross-border eID
 - Not clear on MS responsibility
 - Not clear on the actual interoperability of technology between the MS
- Open issues with regards the Regulation
 - Decide whether the 3 processes are under the scope of the regulation or under the common measures
 - Find principles of the Regulation with respect to the level of assurance
- Continue on 2nd day: Find out which properties are necessary for health professionals → statements required
